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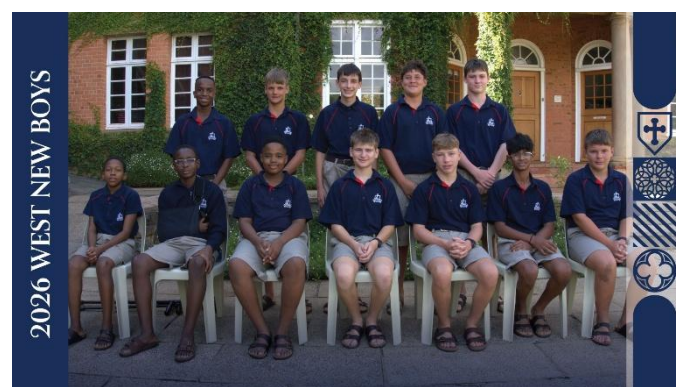
Rector's Message

As most of you are aware, we have had a **change in the leadership of the school this year**. Our **Chaplain Reverend Chris Meyer** and **Financial Director Mrs Joni Warburton** complete the Executive Committee. **Mr Brandon Venter** is the Acting Housemaster of McCormick House and **Mr Ed Jeffrey** is the Acting Senior Housemaster. **Mrs Tanith von Mayer** takes over

many of my academic responsibilities and will be running the academic programme. We have a dedicated and hardworking leadership team who have the best interests of the boys, the school and the staff at heart.

We have welcomed **four new teachers** to Michaelhouse this year. **Mr James Alderman** has joined our English Department. Previously, he was at Selborne College where he taught English and Life Orientation and held leadership roles including Head of House and Head of Exchange. James has also coached water polo and rugby at a high level at several leading schools. He holds a B.Ed and a Bachelor of Theology (cum laude). He is married to Peta-Jayne. Welcome to Mr Alderman.

New Interns in 2026

We were delighted with the matric results of the A Block of 2025 which were released on Monday. Our boys achieved 2.8 As per boy, including Further Studies subjects and 12 subject results are in the top 1% in South Africa. Our *dux* was **Reily Elliot** who achieved 94.1% with 8 distinctions and our *proxime accessit* which is the person who comes second was **Oliver Bruyns** on 92.6%, also achieving 8 distinctions. Third place went to **Simon Bailes** with an average of 92.1% and 8 distinctions. **Roelof Rossouw** was placed fourth with an average of 91.9% and a fantastic 9 distinctions. Oliver Bruyns, Luke Camerer and Reily Elliot all appear on the **IEB's Outstanding Achievements List** (top 5% in 6 subjects and a distinction in Life Orientation) while Simon Bailes appears on the **IEB's Commendable Achievements List** (top 5% in 5 subjects and a distinction in Life Orientation).

These results are the culmination of a significant amount of endeavour from our boys and from our wonderful team of teachers. Once again, some of our most remarkable achievements lie in getting some of our less academically capable boys over the line.

Yesterday we received the tremendously exciting news that **Roelof Rossouw** (West 2025) has received provisional acceptance to study Maths and Computer Science at Wadham College, Oxford University. Roelof's acceptance is conditional on him achieving success in A-Levels in Mathematics and Further Mathematics which he will write in May this year. He is well on track for such success and is destined to start at Oxford in September this year.

Getting an Oxbridge (Oxford or Cambridge) place is an exceptional achievement for any student anywhere in the world. To get provisional acceptance without having written A-Levels is as rare as it is remarkable. Exceptional results (Roelof achieved 99% for Mathematics and 94% for IT in the IEB examinations) are not nearly enough as one is competing with hundreds of students globally with similarly exceptional results. Roelof's significant success in the National Maths Olympiad (top 50 in SA and top in KZN) and South African Computer Olympiad (top 6 in SA) would have greatly strengthened his application. This, with his performance on the Oxford Maths Admissions Test, combined with his reference and personal statement would have all helped Roelof to secure an interview. Much store is set by the interview where candidates need to be able to converse and discuss complex issues relating to their desired course of study. Roelof thinks beautifully and is able to communicate even the most complex ideas with great clarity

and to make these accessible to others. Roelof underwent a total of three interviews, and he clearly impressed the interviewers to the extent that he has been offered a place! Well done, Roelof! We could not be more proud of you.

As a school we are thrilled with Roelof's acceptance to Oxford just one year after hearing of Luke Kaufmann's (East 2024) acceptance to Cambridge. Luke started at Cambridge in September 2025.

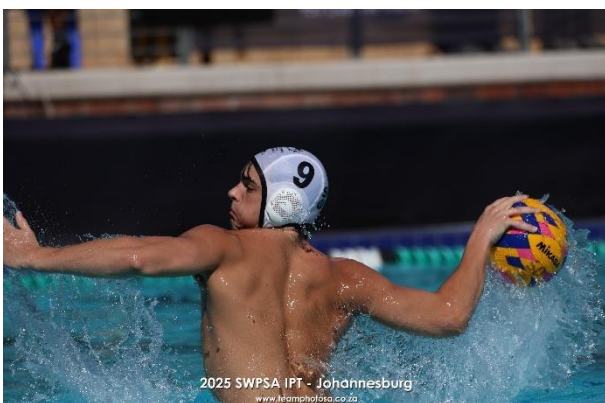

Cricket

The Michaelhouse 1st XI began their season with a tour to Makhanda, where they faced strong opposition in a series of four fixtures: two declaration (time) games, one 50-over match, and a T20 contest. The tour provided an excellent opportunity for the squad to gain valuable match experience early in the season, adapt to different formats, and build team cohesion.

The opening fixture against Graeme College was a time game in which Michaelhouse posted 194 all out, thanks to a composed innings of 66 from **Graydon Leslie**. In response, Graeme College was dismissed for 120, giving Michaelhouse a first-innings victory by 74 runs. The second time game against St Alban's College saw Michaelhouse dominate once again. St Alban's managed only 85 in their first innings, before Michaelhouse replied with 162 for 7 declared. St Alban's closed their second innings on 22 for 2, ensuring a first-innings win for Michaelhouse.

The third fixture, a 50-over contest against Kingswood College, proved more challenging. Kingswood was bowled out for 118, with **Preston Greene** delivering an outstanding spell of 4/35 in 10 overs. However, Michaelhouse faltered in their chase, collapsing to 63 all out and conceding defeat by 55 runs. This match served as a reminder of the importance of application and composure when chasing modest targets under pressure.

The final game was a T20 clash against St Andrew's College, which produced a thrilling finish. Michaelhouse posted 152 for 9, driven by a remarkable unbeaten 107 off 62 balls from **Graydon Leslie**. St Andrew's fought hard in reply, reaching 147 for 7, but Michaelhouse held their nerve to secure a six-run victory. This performance showcased the team's ability to adapt to the demands of the shortest format and highlighted Graydon's match-winning capability.

Overall, the Makhanda tour was highly successful, with Michaelhouse winning three of their four fixtures. The team displayed resilience, tactical awareness, and moments of individual brilliance.

The Michaelhouse U15A cricket team enjoyed a competitive and valuable tour to the Makhanda Schools Cricket Festival, where they were tested against strong opposition from Grey High, Pearson, St Andrew's and Graeme College.

The tour began with a high-scoring time match against Grey High. Michaelhouse posted an impressive 392, with **Daniel Rees** producing an outstanding innings of 252. Grey High replied with 252 without loss, and the match was drawn after time ran out.

Against Pearson, Michaelhouse bowled well and felt in control of the game, restricting Pearson to 161 and bowling them out, with a fine bowling performance from **James Buys**, who took 4 for 31. **Daniel Rees** again led the batting with 56 as Michaelhouse were bowled out for 131, resulting in a first-innings loss.

The highlight of the tour came in the 50-over fixture against St Andrew's. Michaelhouse scored 231 for 8, built around a fluent 52 from **Luke Mallett** and an excellent unbeaten 69 from **Joshua Hoskins**. The bowling attack then delivered a strong collective performance to dismiss St Andrew's for 127, with **William Rattray** taking 4 for 46, giving Michaelhouse a convincing 104-run victory.

The tour concluded with a T20 match against Graeme College. Michaelhouse restricted Graeme to 104 all out, with **Luke Mallett** claiming 3 for 25. The target was comfortably chased down, with **James Velleman** finishing on an unbeaten 31 as Michaelhouse won by five wickets
