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Rector's Message

The term has begun with tremendous energy and enthusiasm from both boys and staff, setting a very positive tone for the weeks ahead. It has been heartening to see the boys return with such commitment, spirit, and pride in the school.

Our Inter-House Swimming Gala was a highlight, showcasing excellent performances in the pool and outstanding House spirit. The boys supported their Houses with great enthusiasm, making it a memorable and enjoyable occasion for all involved.

We also enjoyed an excellent fixture against Durban High School, with strong performances across the pools, basketball courts, and cricket fields. The level of competition and commitment displayed by our boys was impressive.

In Assembly, we had the pleasure of handing out academic awards in recognition of the excellent results achieved by many boys last year. These outcomes reflect their hard work and dedication, as well as the support of our staff.

It has been a very encouraging start to the term, and we look forward to building on this momentum in the weeks ahead.

There are two important matters I reinforced with the boys during assembly on Monday, both of which are essential to the safe and effective functioning of the school.

Firstly, the boys have been reminded that when the lightning alarm sounds, they must immediately get under

proper cover, with a roof over their heads, and remain there until the all-clear is given. This applies during all activities, including sports fixtures and practices, and to visiting teams as well. Lightning is highly unpredictable and can strike even under clear skies. We are painfully aware of past tragedies at Michaelhouse and at other schools, and trees on our campus are struck by lightning with concerning regularity. At times, boys may need to wait patiently under cover while transport is organised, but this is non-negotiable. Safety must always come first.

Secondly, an important part of a Michaelhouse education is learning to engage with others in a respectful and thoughtful manner. Boys are reminded to think before they speak and to avoid remarks that may be intended as humorous but are, in fact, hurtful. Cutting, aggressive, or disparaging comments, particularly those relating to race or gender, have no place here. In line with the values of the South African Constitution, we seek to promote equality, inclusion, and respect for all. Behaviour that undermines these values will be taken seriously and will carry consequences. Michaelhouse is a place of belonging and hurtful comments undermine that sense of belonging.

We value the partnership we share with parents in reinforcing these expectations as we work together to educate young men of character.

ADAM Parent Portal Information

As part of our commitment to excellence in boarding and education we have adopted a new school management system to better enable us to provide world-class education and pastoral care. Our new system, ADAM, will replace iSAMS as our core software to manage academic and pastoral data. ADAM is a South African product developed for the South African education system. We join a community of over 70 independent schools nationwide who are already using ADAM.

ADAM has a number of advantages over our previous system while meeting all of our existing requirements. In the near future ADAM will enable you, as parents, to submit leave requests, view leave balances, organise meetings with your son's teachers at open days and receive communication from us.

We have already started the process of setting up the parent portal but before we can roll this out to parents we need accurate family and pupil information. Most importantly we need each parent's ID or passport number as well as a valid email address.

This morning, you would have received an email from Michaelhouse's ADAM with a link to update your family details. This email was sent to the email address we have on record. Clicking on the link in the email will enable you to submit updated information about your family and son(s). This link expires after 14 days so we ask that you please attend to this timeously.

Please verify that this email has not been sent to your junk folder. If you have not received this email it is possible that your email address may be incorrect on our system: if this is the case please email servicedesk@michaelhouse.org with your correct email address.

It is imperative that you complete this online form so that when the time comes you will be able to log into the ADAM parent portal to view academic reports and book leaves.

Sport and Individual Achievements

Cricket

Despite on-and-off rain throughout the day, Michaelhouse delivered an outstanding performance against Durban High School, winning 8 of the 11 completed fixtures across all age groups.

The 1st XI set the tone with a comfortable six-wicket victory. After bowling DHS out for 133/7, Michaelhouse cruised to 136/4 in just 29 overs. **Liam O'Dwyer** starred with the ball, taking 4/18 in 10 overs, while **Benjamin Heuer** blasted 50 off 34 balls.

The 2nd XI chased down DHS's 213/8 in 37.4 overs for another six-wicket win. **Nathan Simons** was superb with 3/15 in 10 overs, while **Henry Love** (68)* and **James Mallett** (66) anchored the chase with a match-winning partnership.

The 3rd XI produced the days best bowling display, dismissing DHS for just 63. **Sharav Reddy** (4/13), **Callum Fly** (3/8) and **Heath Turner** (3/12) tore through the opposition before Michaelhouse secured a four-wicket victory.

The 4th XI completed the senior sweep with a dominant nine-wicket win, restricting DHS to 59/5 before cruising to 63/1 in just 6.4 overs.

The U14A struggled in their first match, while the U16A were bowled out for 118 despite **Nishay Sudhoowa's** fighting 52. The U16B fixture was abandoned due to rain.

The U14B posted a comprehensive win, defeating DHS by 89 runs. **Fynn Mc Kenna** scored 62 off 55 balls before **Joseph Bates (3/6)** helped dismiss DHS for just 57.

The U14C held their nerve to defend 108, restricting DHS to 101 for a thrilling 7-run victory. The U15B dominated with bat and ball, posting 156/7 before **Jock Lewis (4/15)** and **Lukholo Matanzima (3/2)** bowled DHS out for 62. The U15A successfully defended 156/8, with **James Velleman (51)** anchoring the innings before the bowlers dismissed DHS for 139.

The U14D came agonizingly close, posting 85/9 before DHS scraped home at 86/8 by two wickets, despite **Barnaby Webb's** excellent 3/23.
